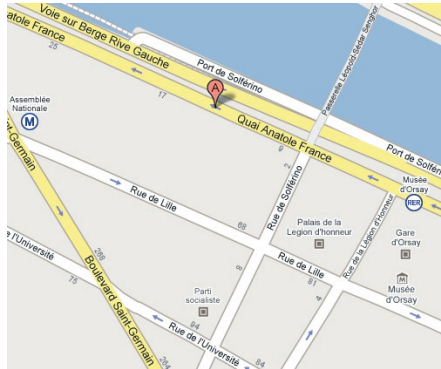

2 Locations in Paris

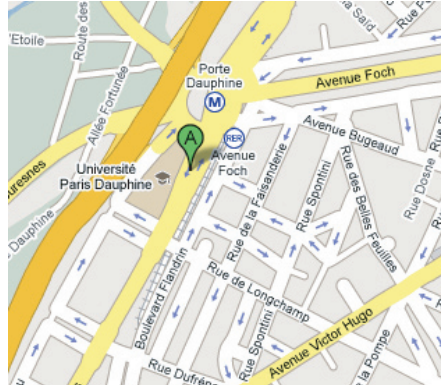
